Brother Knights and Families,

During the month of November, let us be thankful for the routine aspects of our life. We begin the month by celebrating the dual feasts of All Saints Day and All Souls Day. The Church did not always adhere to the strict canonization process of today which demands a miracle of healing to testify to their holiness.

Many men and women were declared saints by the people because of their life of holiness and human goodness. People who were put to death for the faith were immediately declared saints by the Church. All Saints Day recognizes all those we believe are in heaven, not just those who have a special day in the Church year. All Souls Day remembers those who are in Purgatory. We all have different ideas of Purgatory. The official teaching is found in the New Catechism of the Church paragraphs 1030 – 1031. "All who die in God's grace and friendship, but still imperfectly purified are indeed assured of their eternal salvation, but after death they undergo purification, so as to achieve the holiness to enter the joy of heaven. The Church gives the name Purgatory to this final purification of the elect." It says nothing of how this purification happens. We do not know if our deceased loved ones are in heaven or purgatory. Many of us believe that if they endured any long suffering, they should be in heaven. We remember their goodness even though they had faults, in a special way on Nov. 2nd.

We end this month with the holiday of Thanksgiving. It's a special day to remind us of what every day should be. Yes, our country has major difficulties but there is also a lot of goodness, promise and hope. The same may be said of our family and Church as well. However, let us always have an attitude of thankfulness!

Campus Corner - CCA

The CCA students, staff, and parents started out the month by participating in the "National Walk to School Day." The walk began at Lakeshore Lanes, with snacks for all walkers. We were all proudly representing CCA in our school Mass apparel. There were 142 walkers in attendance for this fun annual event!

Christ Child Academy would like to extend a sincere "Thank You" for your support of the annual poinsettia and greenery voucher sale. Whether you bought a poinsettia to decorate your home, give as a gift, or donate to church in memory of a loved one, your generosity is greatly appreciated!

CCA students in grades 5-8 will take turns volunteering at the Sheboygan South Catholic Parishes Food Pantry again this year. Each month from October through May our students will assist by helping to set up the food pantry tables, distributing items, and even helping patrons carry their items to their vehicles. The SSCP Food Pantry will play a large part in how we prepare students to live as Christ did. Students will volunteer in the pantry to garner first-hand experience at how their work impacts their neighborhood.

October is National Bullying Prevention Month and Christ Child Academy is joining the STOMP Out Bullying campaign. The goal is to encourage communities to work together to stop bullying and cyber bullying by increasing awareness of the prevalence and impact of bullying on children of all ages. Each Tuesday CCA has a theme with a corresponding dress up day: Wear an orange shirt in support of National Bullying Prevention Month; "Bullying is CRAZY!" by wearing mismatched clothing; "Bullies make us blue" by wearing the color blue; "Put bullying to rest" by wearing pajamas; "Don't by a bully; catch the wave of kindness" by wearing Hawaiian or bright colors. The weekly theme and dress up day helps the students be more engaged and take an active stance on this important topic.

Since October is Fire Safety Awareness Month, the Sheboygan Fire Department conducted safety and fire prevention education for Kindergarten through 4th grade at Fire Station #3 earlier this month. This educational program is valuable for reinforcement of fire safety messages for children as they grow and develop safe behaviors.

Christ Child Academy celebrated Grandparents Day on October 16th. Grandparents joined us in the celebration of mass, followed by special songs and entertainment. All then processed to the gym for refreshments and a project. Grands helped their grandchildren create a Christmas ornament and card that will be shared with the Project Angel Hugs Program. This program supplies gifts and treats for children in our community suffering the effects of childhood cancers. Grandparents were then invited to the classrooms to get a feel for how our days go at CCA. It was an awesome day! Thanks to all who attended.

The middle school students and teachers hosted an all-school Living Rosary on Thursday, October 24, in honor of this being the month of the Most Holy Rosary. We gathered in darkness in the gym and prayed the Luminous Mysteries. All students were given a glow in the dark rosary and glow sticks were placed on the floor of the gym as each prayer was prayed. This created a beautiful glowing image of the rosary at the conclusion of our prayer.

CCA also held Parent/Student/Teacher Conferences this month. The conferences give the opportunity to open the lines of communication with parents and to see the students' progress since the beginning of school. We are proud to report nearly 100% attendance at these important visits.

Congratulations to the CCA Cross Country Team and the Girls Volleyball Team on a great season of learning individual and team skills, sportsmanship, and good teamwork!

=(This school year, Christ Child Academy has continued with the Virtues in Practice program. The program was developed by the Dominican Sisters of St. Cecilia Congregation and offers a three-year cycle of virtues based on the theological virtues of Faith, Hope, and Love. We are on year two, the Year of Hope. Each month, students from PreK to 8th grade are introduced to a new virtue and a fitting saint that exemplifies that virtue. Monthly virtue home projects are assigned throughout the grades so that this virtue cannot be a definition that is taught, but a habit that is formed. The students will use Virtue in Practice booklets in the classroom to study each virtue through the designated saint during the month.

We are excited to launch the Christ Child Academy Annual Fund! This yearly campaign is vital to raising the unrestricted funds that allow us to narrow the gap between tuition and the true cost of a Christ Child Academy education. A successful Annual Fund also enables us to respond to immediate needs as they arise, ensuring our students continue to benefit from a well-rounded and exceptional education.

Halloween festivities will wrap up our second full month of school. We will enjoy a costumed parade where all students will be able to see each others costumes, a costume contest in the middle school, and grade level parties in the afternoon.
