Years of pro-life work and prayers were answered on June 24 when the Supreme Court ruled that there is no “right to abortion” stated or implied in our Constitution, and Roe v Wade was overturned. The abortion issue is now left to the individual states to decide.

So why do we continue to participate in 40 Days for Life when no abortions are being done in Wisconsin? Many states, including our neighbors, Illinois and Minnesota, still allow abortion. Planned Parenthood offices in Wisconsin continue to sell abortions and refer women to another state for their abortion. They are spending massive amounts of money to make the abortion pill available by mail across state lines. From the moral perspective the Dobbs decision decided nothing. We have won one battle, but not the war against abortion. We continue to ask God to change hearts and minds as we speak the truth that abortion, intentionally and directly ending the life of an innocent unborn human being, is wrong. The value of an unborn child is not determined by where his/her parents live, nor by the circumstances of his/her conception. Life is a gift from God. We are made in God's image.

We continue to pray for women (and men) who feel that abortion is their only option when faced with an unplanned pregnancy, and for healing for those who have had abortions. We are ready to direct them to our local pregnancy help center, Anchor of Hope, for free life-affirming care, alternatives to abortion, and post-abortive counseling.

Prayer and Fasting, Constant Vigil, and Community Outreach are the components to 40 Days for Life. **With love take a stand for TRUTH and LIFE—abortion is not health care, abortion is not pro-women. All human life, regardless of the stage, is precious in the eyes of God.** It is I who deal death and give life. Deuteronomy 32:39

Chaplain's Column

Brother Knights and Families,

October is a very special month for our Council 722. October 7th is the feast day of our namesake, “Our Lady of the Rosary.” Whether we pray the Rosary daily, weekly, occasionally or not at all, the mysteries of the Rosary challenge us to live our life in imitation of Christ’s truths. This explanation of the feast is taken from the Looseleaf Lectionary published by the Liturgical Press.

The feast was instituted by Pope Saint Pius V on the anniversary of the naval victory won by the Christian forces over a powerful pagan force at Lepanto in 1571, a victory attributed to the Mother of God, whose aid had been invoked through the Holy Rosary. The celebration is a stimulus to all to meditate on the mysteries of Christ under the guidance of the Blessed Virgin Mary, who was so closely associated with the incarnation, passion and obvious resurrection of the Son of God.

Nationally the Catholic Church dedicates October to Respect for Life in many areas. January centers only on the “abortion issues.” Respect for Life includes an end to the death penalty and assisted suicide, how we are misusing the earth God has created and we are challenged to properly develop, true racial injustice, and health care for the young and elderly.

May God’s wisdom guide all of our efforts.

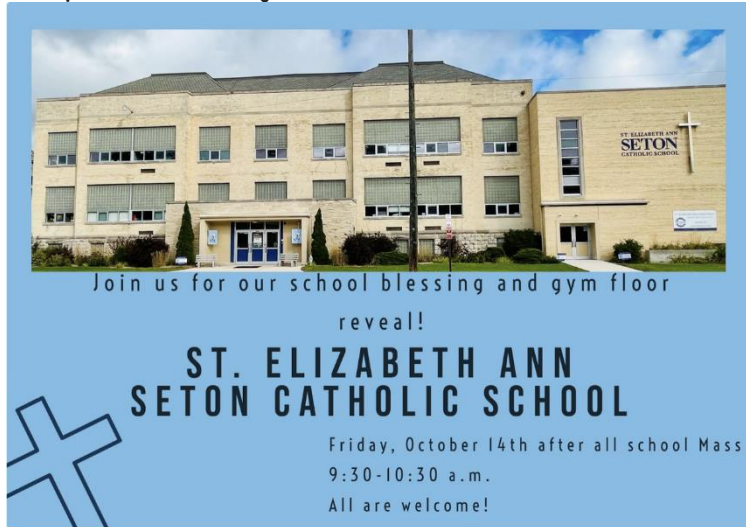
