"That one is too skinny. What else you got?" says the man.


The butcher takes the bird back into the freezer and waits a few minutes, and brings the same turkey back out to the man.

Happy Fall to all! CCA will be wrapping up its second month of school shortly. After a delayed and sad start to our year, we are settling in and adjusting to our new normal. The retreat provided students the opportunity to step away from the busy rhythms of life and pray, rest, and reflect.
