

Chaplain's Column

Brother Knights and Families,

I found this report very interesting and stimulating. A recent survey indicates that only about 33% of so-called Catholics believe in the true presence! These statements are from "Called to Eucharistic Living" by Michael R. Heinlein in Our Sunday Visitor, Jan. 25-29, 2022.

Receiving the Eucharist as a gift then means that we accept the gift on Christ's terms; that we receive what Christ intended by it, which is to say we allow our lives, with the help of his grace, to be modeled after Christ's own.

More specifically the bishop, exhorts Eucharistic consistency; "We all need to be consistent in bringing the love of Christ not only to our personal lives, but also every dimension of our public lives.

When sin is relativized, trivialized and even lauded in celebration of an "I've got to be me" generation, the Eucharist proposes the proper response – indeed Christ's own after having instituted the memorial of what he was soon to accomplish on the cross; "Father... not as I will, but as you will."

I will have more on this topic. Enjoy the fall colors.

Msgr Phillip Dreis Assembly Newsletter... Continued

In Matthew's Gospel on this 26th week of Ordinary Time, we hear *"The Parable of the two sons."* He tells us about the first son who was told to go out into the vineyard to work and he responded, 'I will not.' But he later changed his mind and went. He told the second son the same thing and he replied, 'Yes sir,' but he didn't go. "Which son did the Father's will?" The chief priests and the elders replied, "The first." Then Jesus got in their face and said: "Tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the Kingdom of God before you." Ouch, that must have raised a few hairs. This scene was not too long after Jesus found out about the beheading of John the Baptist, so I'm sure he was still grieving his loss. Then He added: "When John came to you in the way of righteousness, you did not believe him, but tax collectors and prostitutes did.

To put this in the context of today, it would be as if I were to criticize our priest or bishop for preaching about the "Good News" of Jesus Christ, but not acting as Christ would when put under pressure. I, myself could fall under that same judgement when I "talk the good talk" when preaching, but don't reflect the face of Christ in reality.

Another way to bring the actions of the two sons into our day-to-day life is to think about the words at the end of Mass when the Deacon or the Priest says: "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life." Then we respond: "Thanks be to God." But are we really thankful if we don't glorify the Lord by our life? It's as if after we hear the good news of the Gospel, and we don't see the face of Christ in the poor and the destitute. That's as if we look in the mirror, then walk away and forget what we looked like. Or, after we receive the Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist, we then turn our backs to the starvation of others, or a blind eye to the injustice going on around us.
