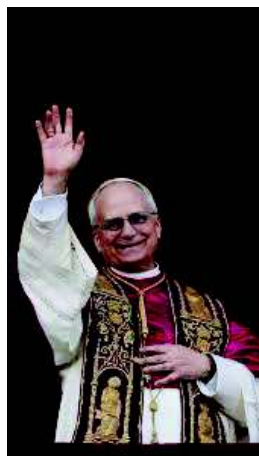

Have a relaxing and safe summer. As you journey to your favorite camping, fishing or hiking area, and marvel on how the children (and adults) have grown up, or going on a special trip, let the beauty of summer remind you of God's comfort, hope, peace and strength.

June is dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Its main theme is the overwhelming love of Jesus showed in his suffering and death on the cross forgiving us from sin.

From the booklet "Catholic Treasures New and Old" by Joanne Turpin, I have adapted this brief explanation.

The particular form of this devotion began after revelations to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque, a 17<sup>th</sup> century French Nun of the Visitation Order. Another revelation requested that reparation for sin be made by the faithful on the First Friday of the Month. This led to the present devotion of receiving Communion on 9 consecutive First Fridays and going to Confession on a regular basis.

May the love and forgiveness of Christ truly guide our daily life.
